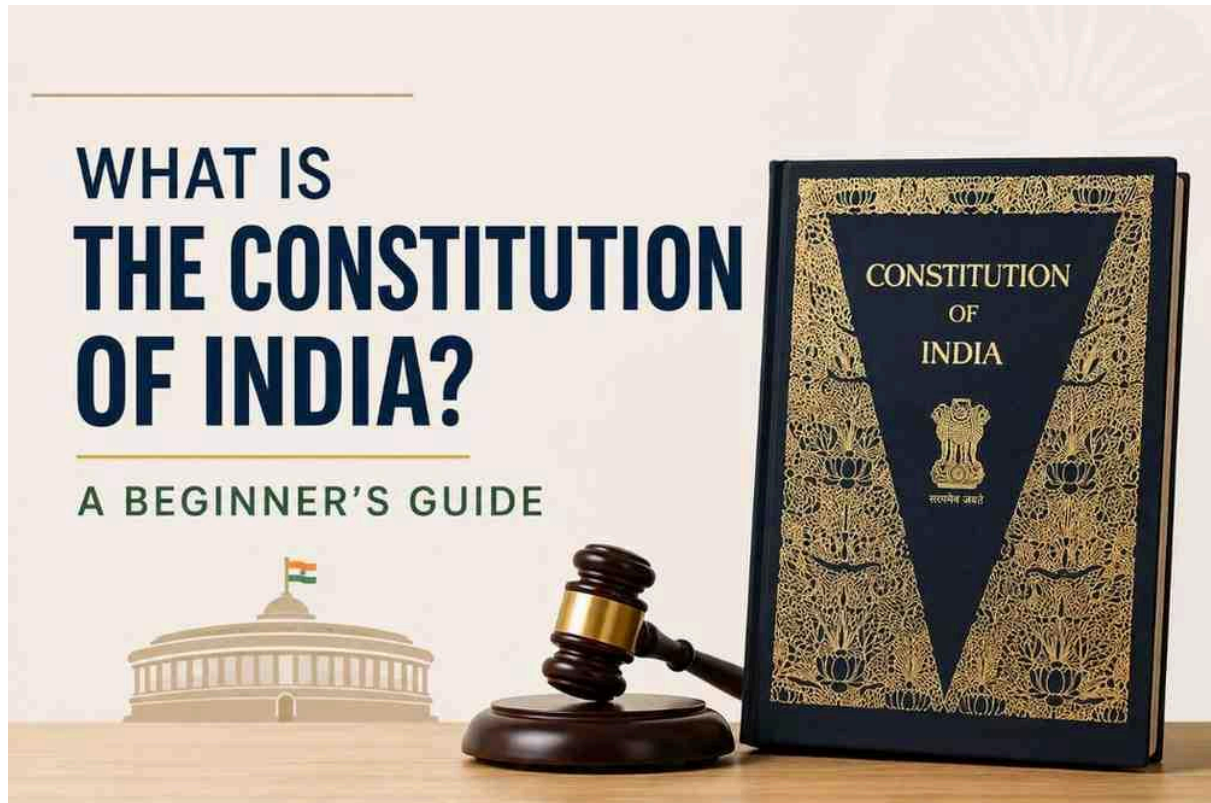


# What Is the Constitution of India? A Beginner's Guide
